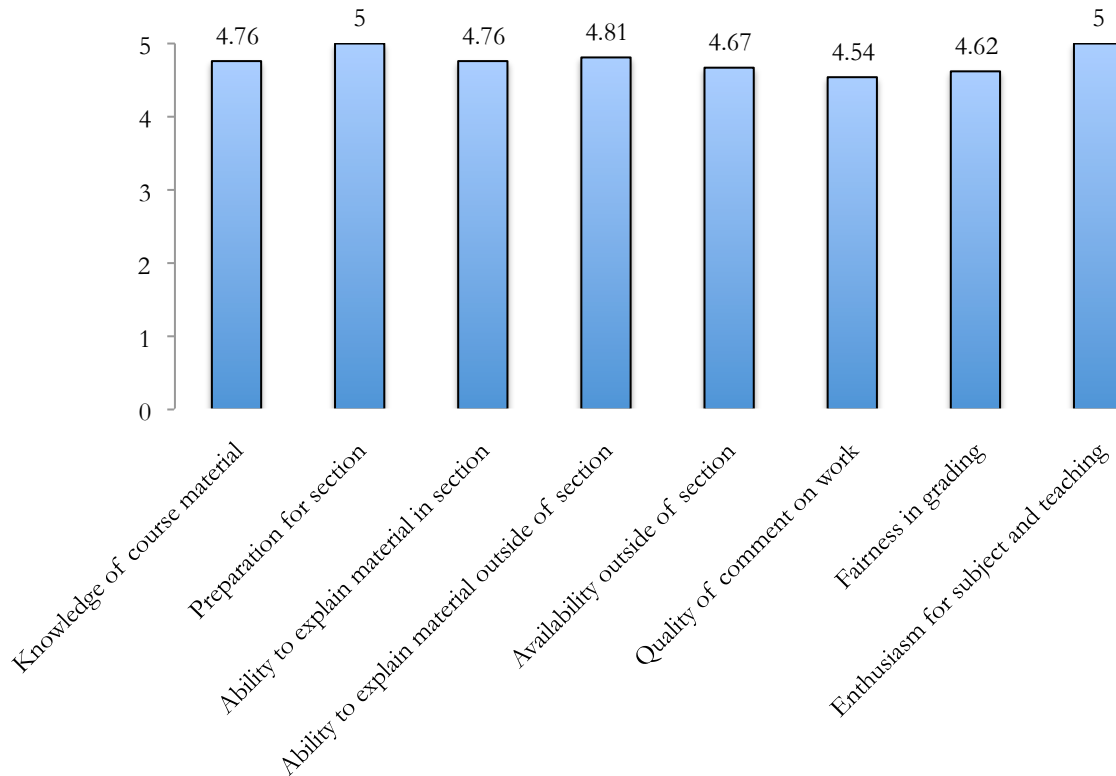


Introduction to Formal Logic Spring 2018
