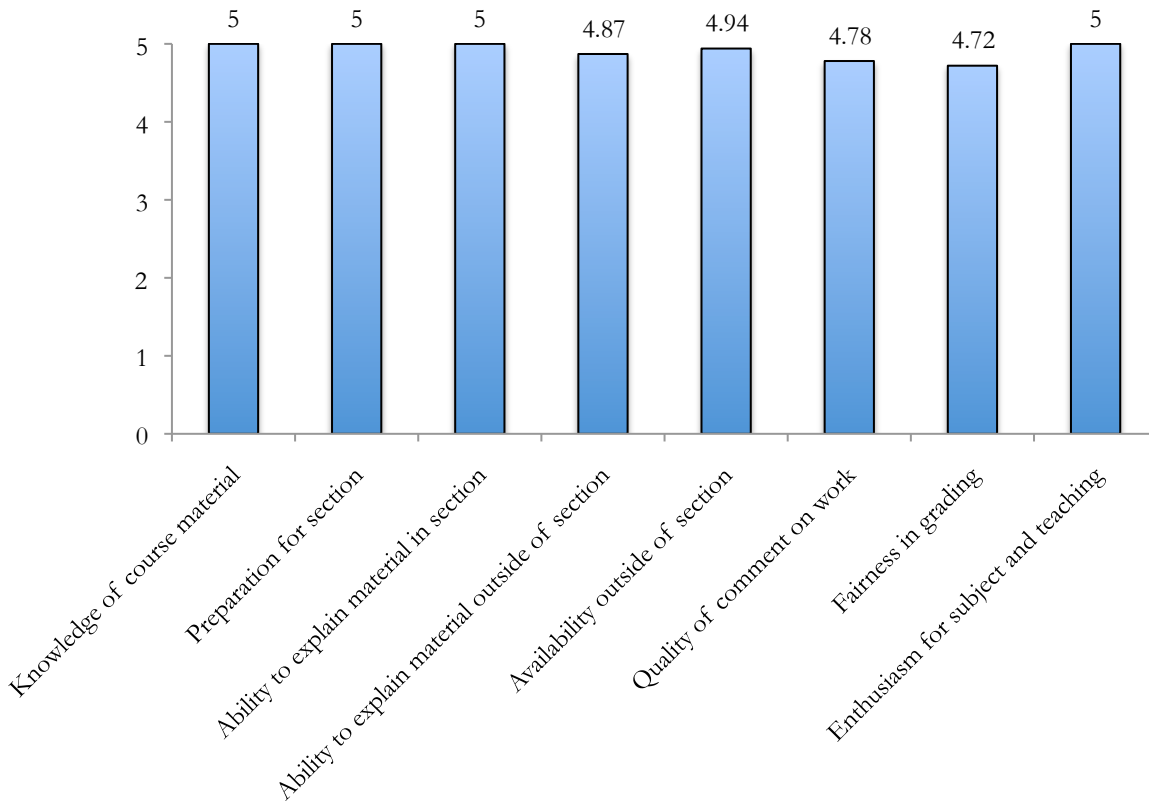


Introduction to Greek Philosophy Fall 2016
