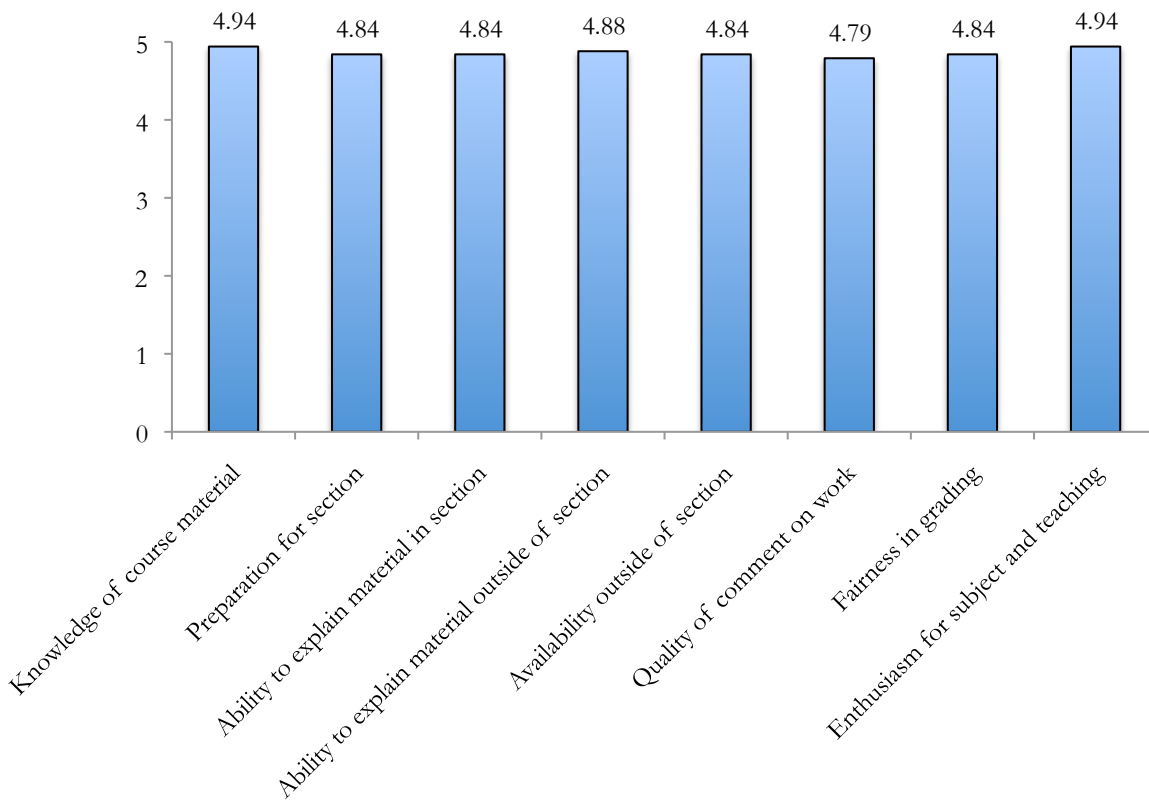


Introduction to Moral Philosophy Spring 2016
